Bodies in this cemetery were removed from the old Favor Cemetery (C-6-26, JCG July 7, 1941) and the John Gordon Cemetery on the old Henry Wells place (C-28-41, JCG Oct. 15, 1939) when the U.S. Government acquired the lower land for the Franklin Flood Control Dam. PSM 6-12-53. Cemetery is in good condition and there are recent interments.

No. 56, apparently one brought from Gordon Cemetery, is a fieldstone which may have been lettered but is now illegible.

No. 59 is a marble marker, unlettered, said by Norma Roberts & U.S.Prescott to mark grave of Sarah A.Wells, wife Rufus Prescott. Iron pipe marks grave of infant of George Roberts & wife. (No. 50). No. 42, Grace Louise, inf. dau. Arthur & Grace Roberts. No. 51, Osborn Roberts. No. 33, Ralph Collins.

Nos. 61, 62, 63 & 65 are probably children of Charles E. & Maria S. Plaisted. Nos. 36 through 41 are probably Hubbards or Herberts. Nos. 43 through 49 are probably Durgins. (Statement of Mrs. Norma Roberts)

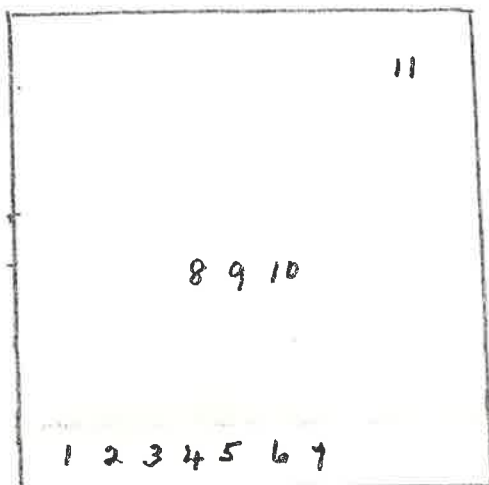

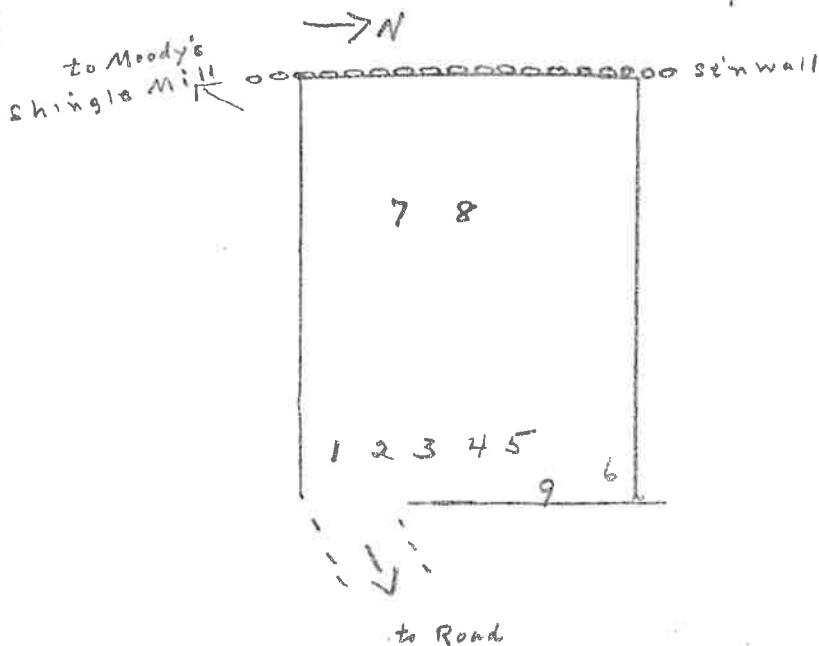

Follow wall from road about half-way up hill from Chase corner to Carlson's, about 150 yds westerly of road. JCG 10-15-39. PSM 6-15-53. This yard has just been cleared, trees and brush cut and leaves raked. The marked stones are flat and displaced.

This yard is on the river's edge on a bluff about 200 feet north of the power line that runs across the lower field or pasture of the Swain farm and in the angle formed by the river and the mouth of the easterly brook on that farm. All headstones are broken and leaning against the south wall but initialed footstones are in place. There was some appearance of other graves and two rough stones that possibly marked a child's grave.

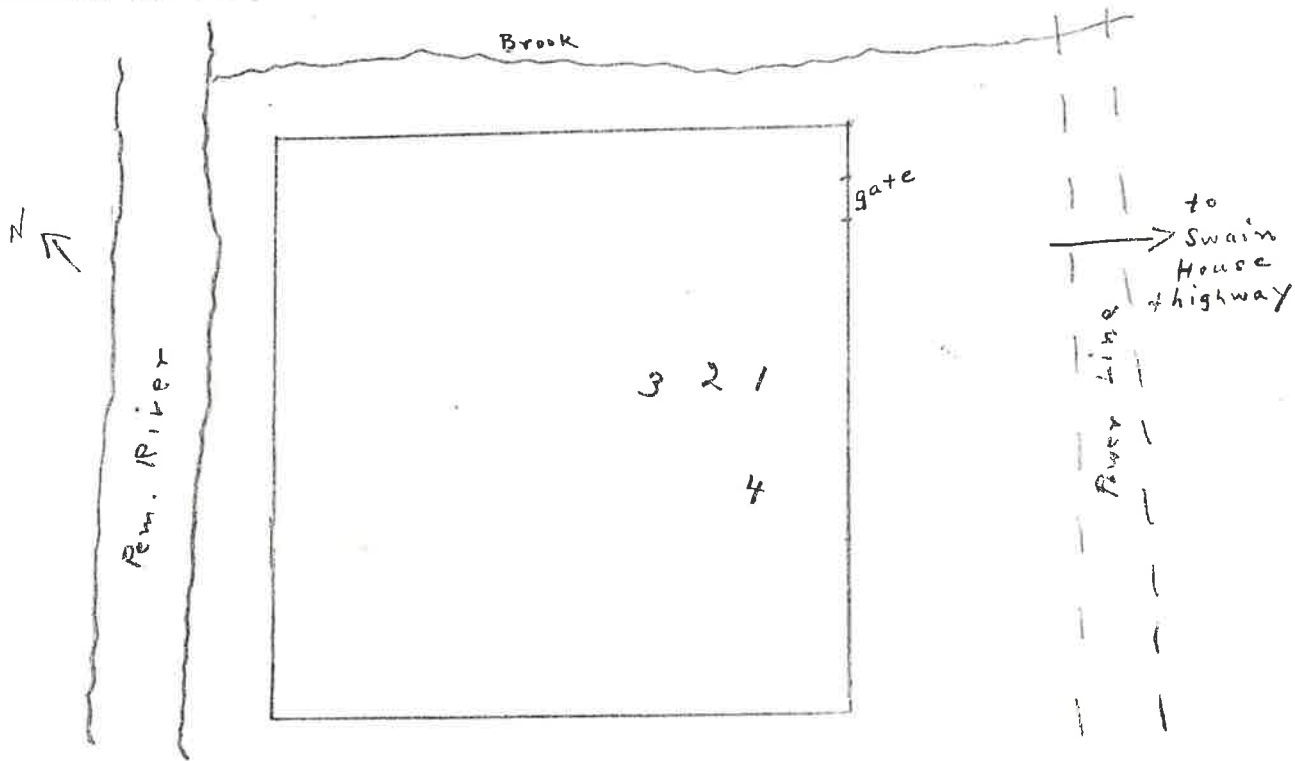

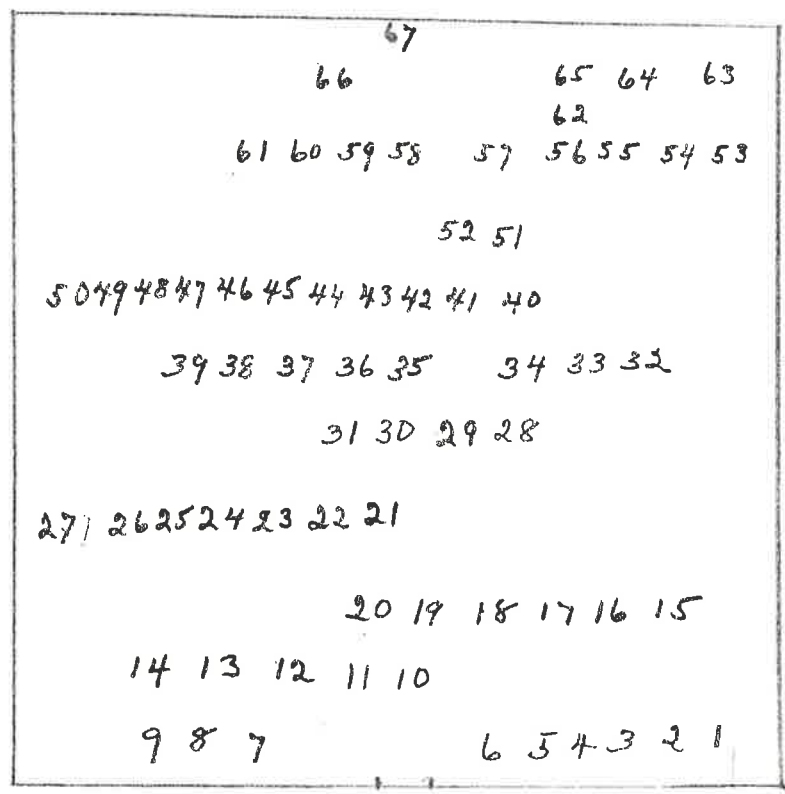

Tradition says that Enoch Gordon is buried in this cemetery, presumably in one of the unmarked graves. PSM remembers as a child seeing William Robinson ("Bill") place a flag on a grave with with a fieldstone marker near the southeast corner, perhaps No. 53 or 54, and this may have been Enoch's grave, although she does not remember ever being told so.

Many stones are crowded & it is difficult to distinguish headstones & footstones & count may not be accurate.

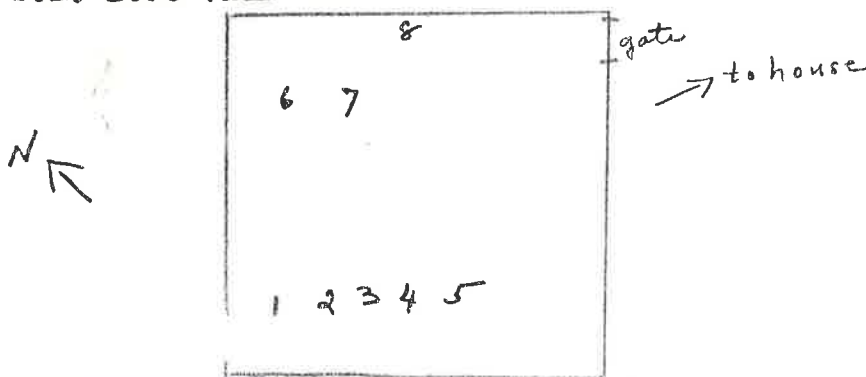

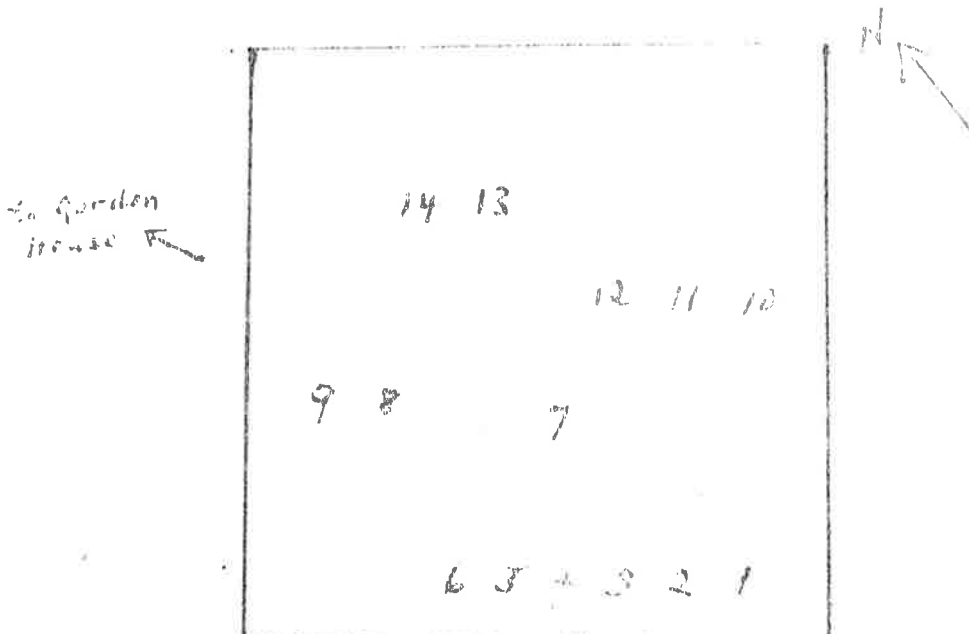

From reference to Bristol History it would appear that No. 2 is Jonathan Dow who died Nov. 6, 1816, ae. 82-5-15. In that case No. 1 would very probably be his wife, Comfort Brown Dew, date and place of death not given in Bristol History. Same source states that Abigail Godfrey, wife of Levi Robinson died Dec. 17, 1822, ae. 64-2-7 which would make it appear that stone No. 3 is hers, in which case No. 4 is probably her husband's, Levi's (a Revolutionary soldier) but nothing can be deciphered now on either No. 1 or No. 4. All other stones except No. 9 are unmarked or show no markings now.
